GIVE THANKS - LILLINGTON COMMUNITY

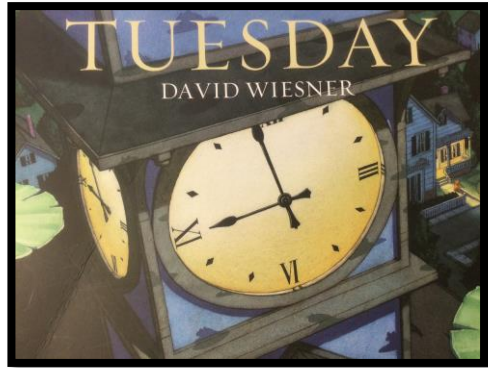

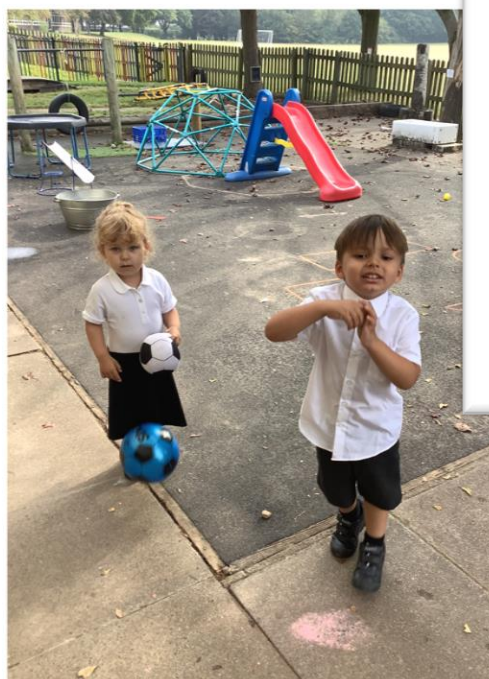
MAPLE CLASS

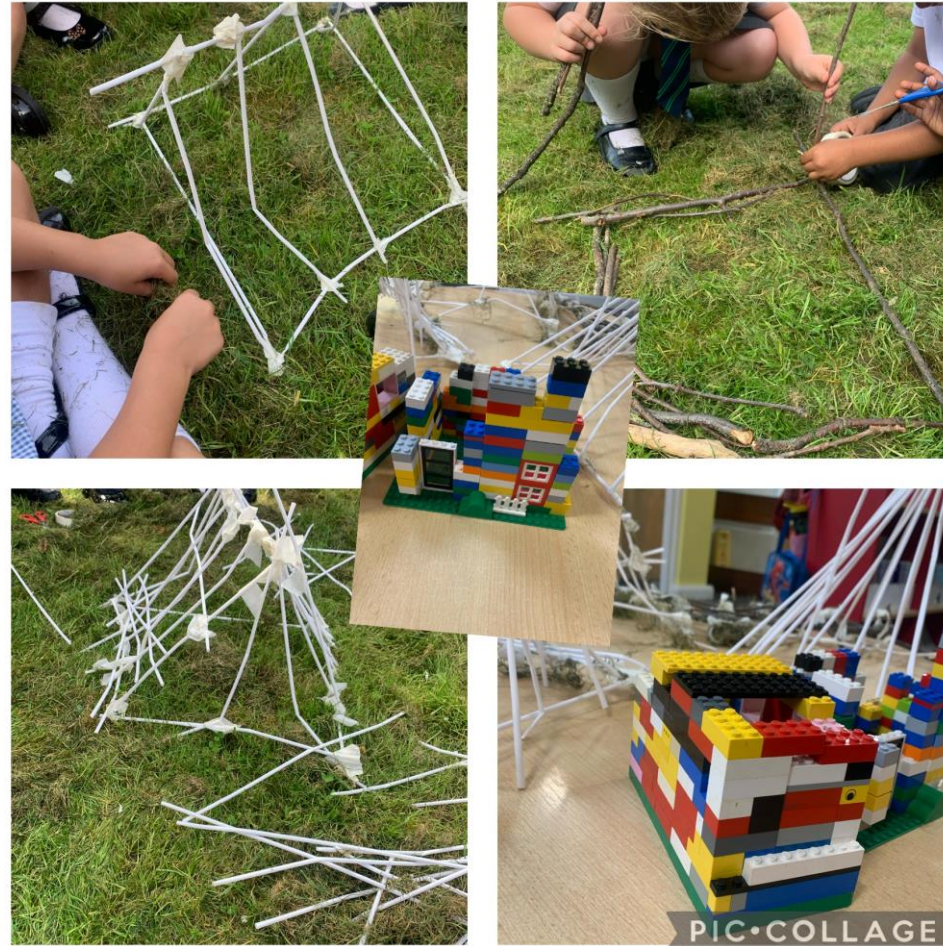

YEAR ONE - DARWIN

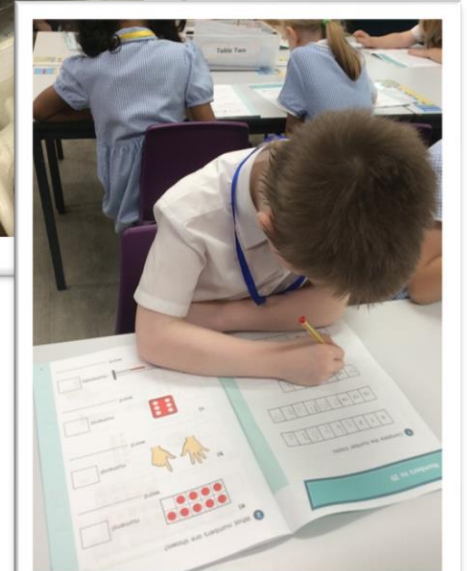
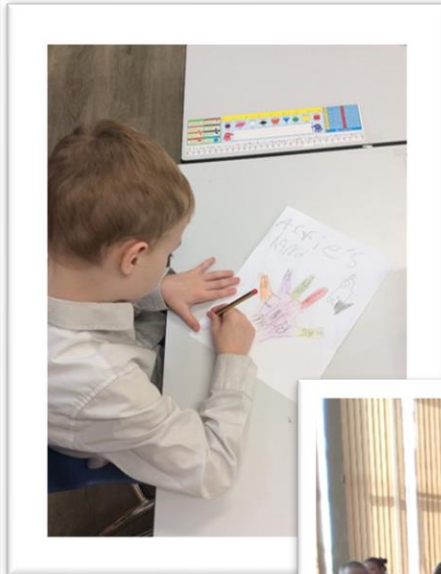
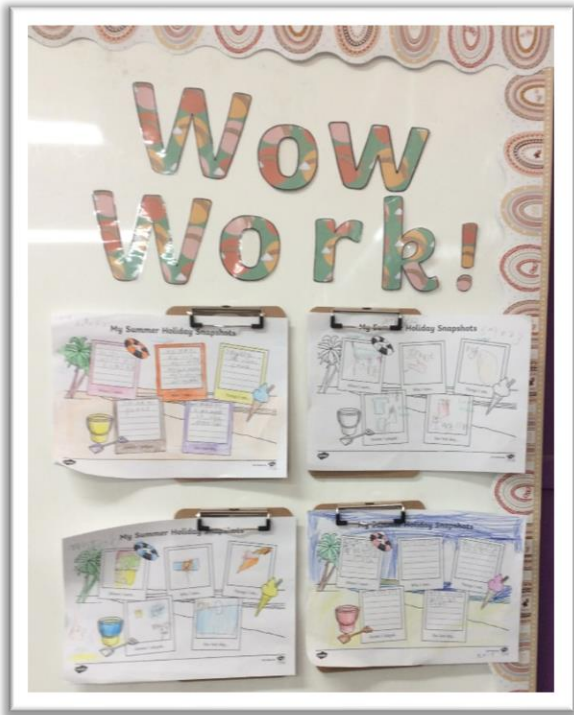

mum was ok I was glad.

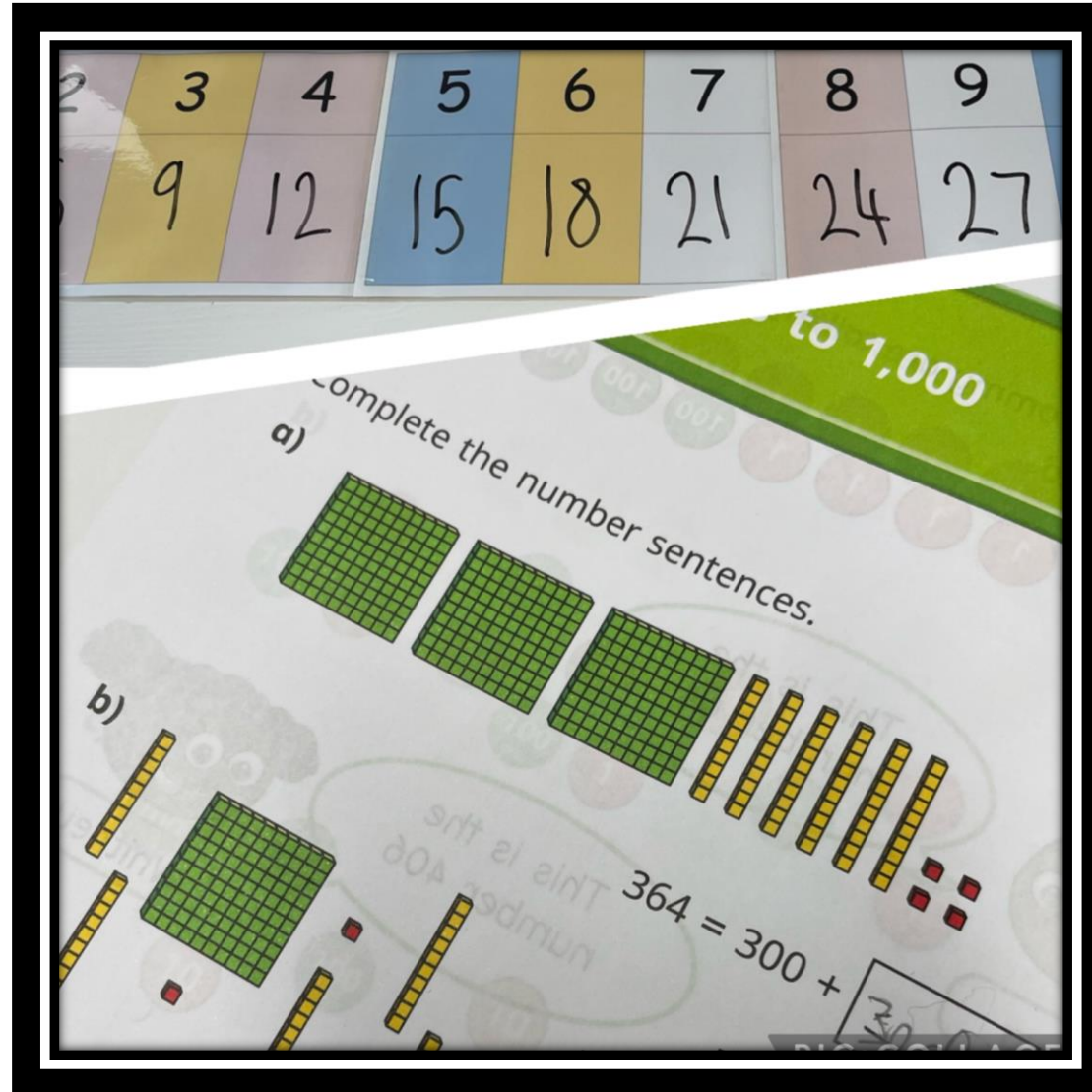
