It's currently **illegal** to ride a **privately** owned e-scooter in any public place

Why is this?

E-scooters are classified as Personal Light Electric Vehicles (PLEVs) so they are treated as motor vehicles and subject to the same legal requirements such as tax and insurance.

The current law is clear

You can buy one but it is illegal to use a PRIVATELY OWNED e-scooter in ANY public space including roads, pavements, parks, town centres or canal towpaths for example. The only place an e-scooter can be used is on private land.

What will happen if I'm stopped by Warwickshire Police?

If you ride an e-scooter on public land and roads you need to comply with a number of conditions including having appropriate insurance. Warwickshire Police has the power to seize e-scooters if you do not have insurance and to prosecute riders - please make sure you keep your privately owned e-scooter on private land so this doesn't happen to you.

Migrant Communities Grant Fund

Closing date 15 October.

The Warwickshire County Council's Migrant Communities Grant Fund is a grant aimed at community and voluntary sector organisations which support asylum seeker, refugee, and migrant communities. The Fund pot of £35,000 is to support small-scale projects across Warwickshire that support the following outcome:

People fleeing conflict and persecution can rebuild their lives in Warwickshire, fulfil their aspirations and contribute to the social, economic and cultural life of the communities they live in.

The Fund replaces the former Community Provision of Conversational English Language Grant Fund whilst offering an additional element of supporting newly established groups with setting up their activities. All applications should meet one or more of the following grant criteria:

- Improve access to services.
- Reduce loneliness and isolation.
- Improve physical and/or mental health and wellbeing.
- Promote equalities and inclusivity.

Applications for the English language element should also aim to increase and/or sustain the capacity of volunteer English language provision across Warwickshire for any newly arrived communities, including refugees, asylum seekers and migrants.
