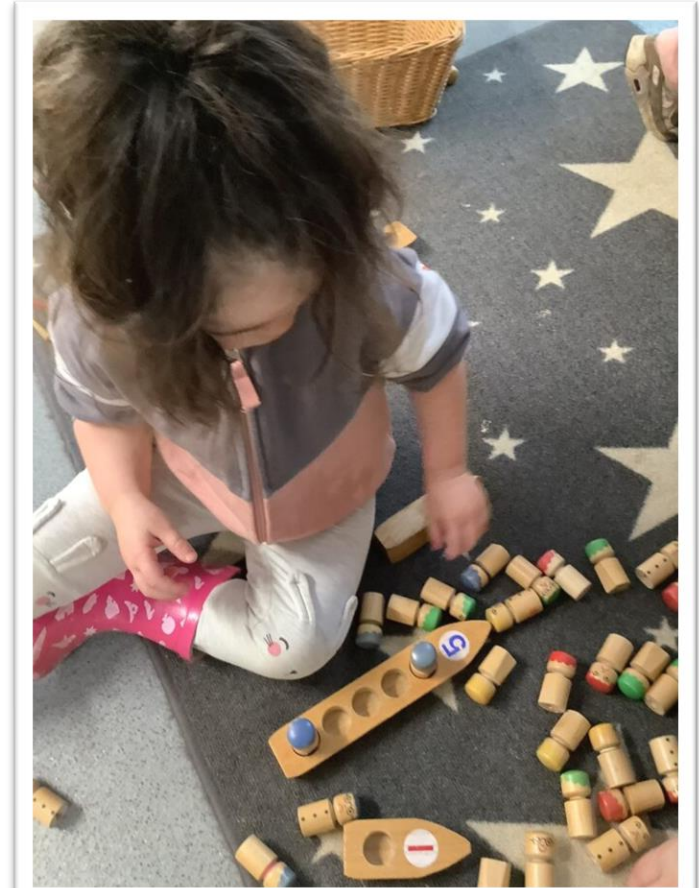

We have also been focusing on counting up to 5.



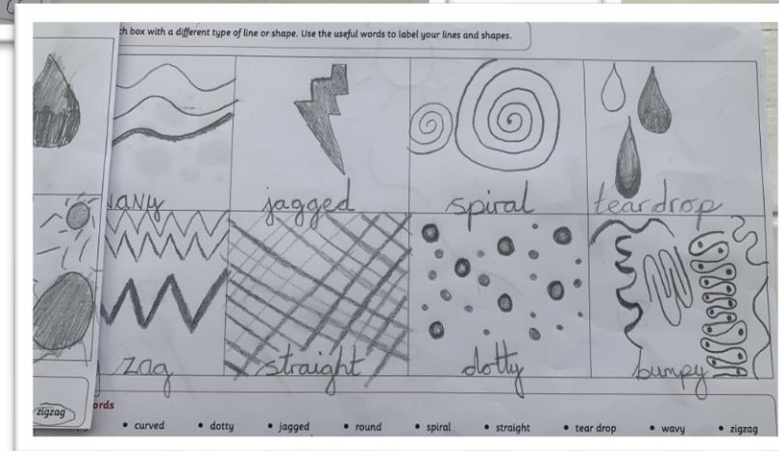
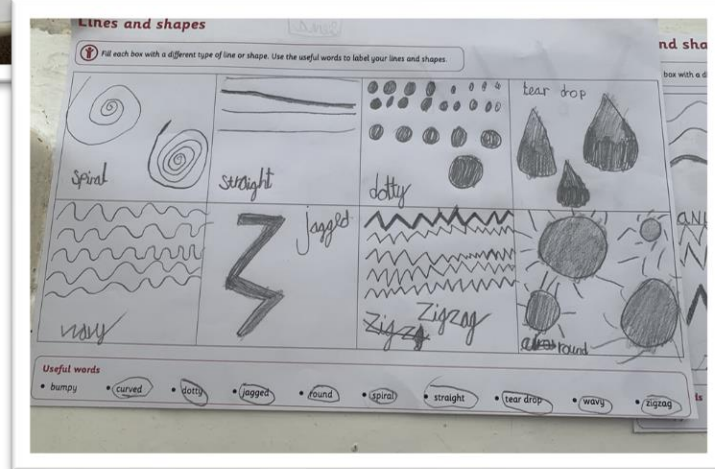
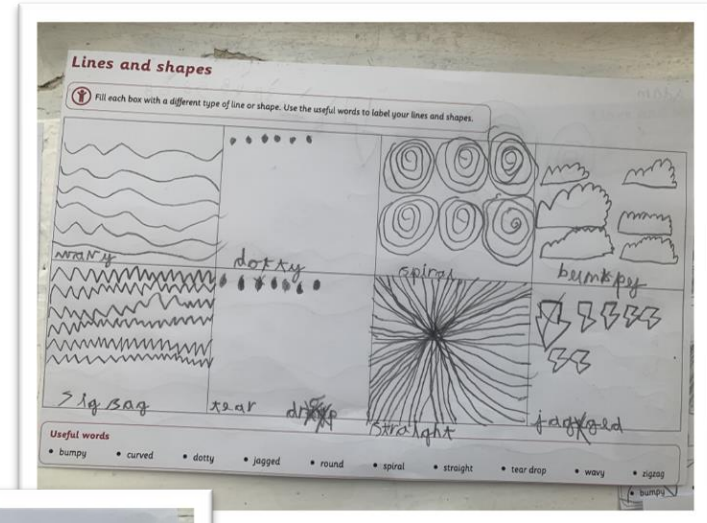
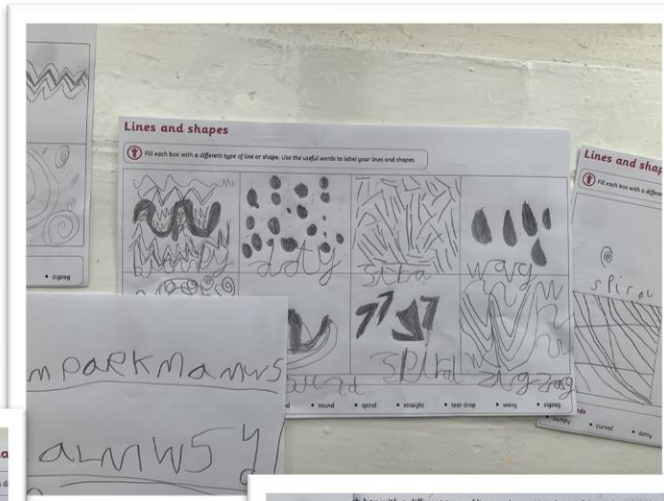
RECEPTION - BEVAN

As part of our topic, 'Build It Up', Reception have been investigating bridges. We looked at pictures of several famous bridges before using lots of materials to make bridges of our own



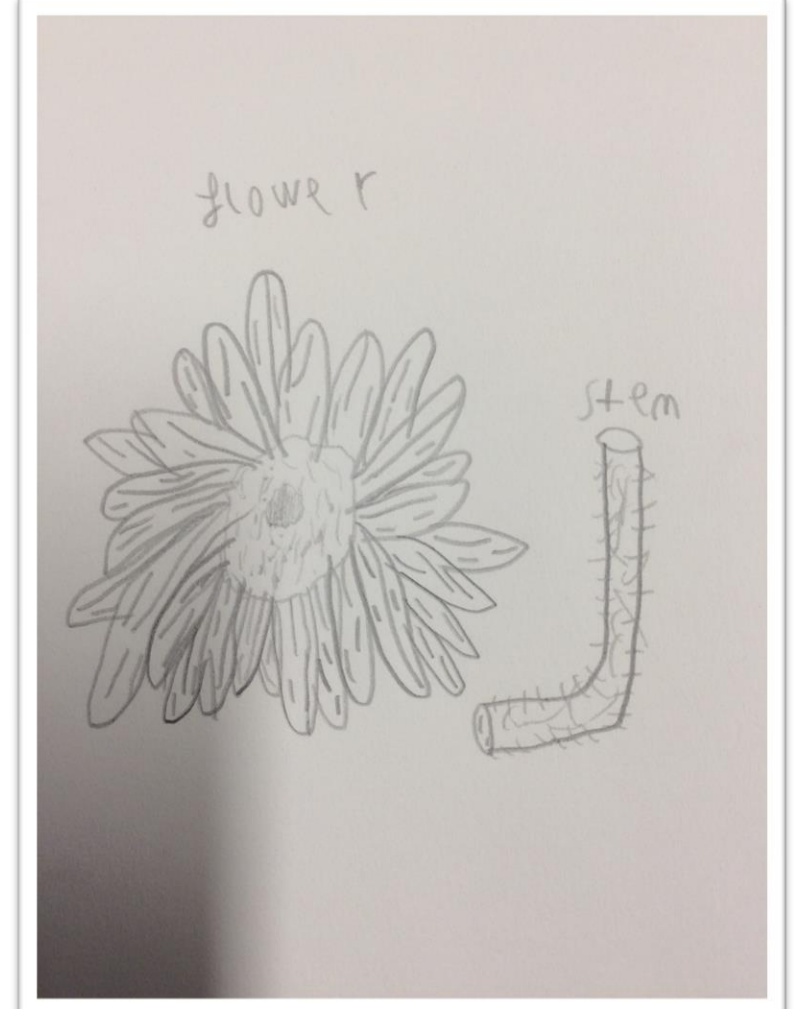
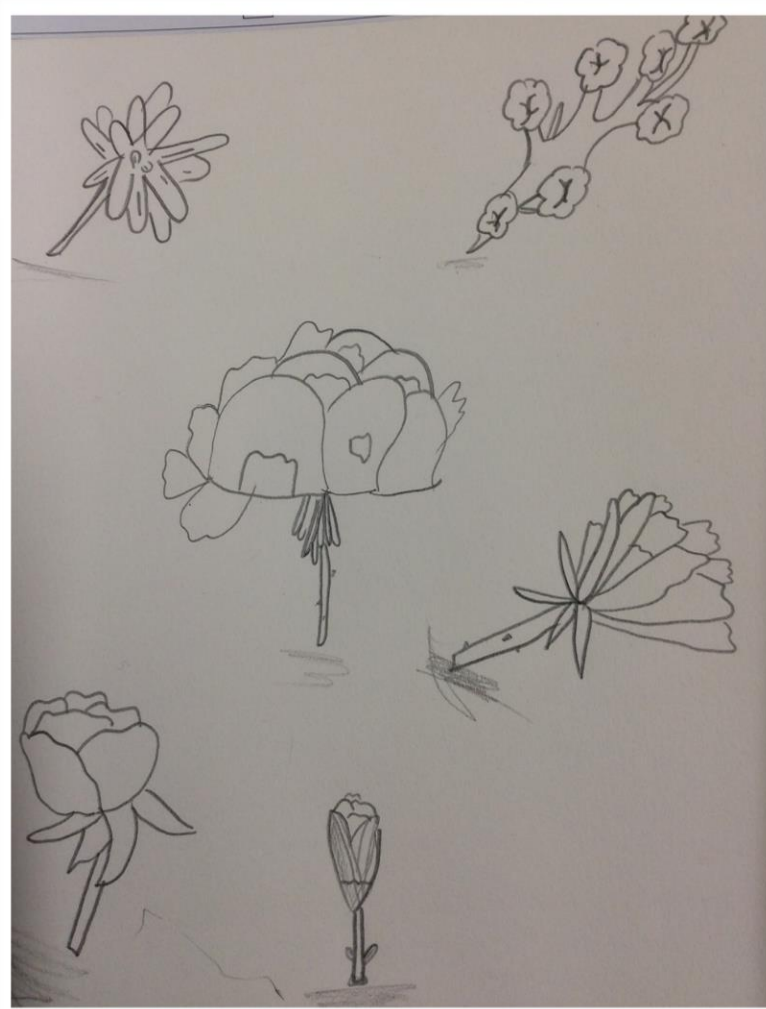
YEAR ONE - DARWIN

Job Opportunity at SYDNI



The SYDNI Centre is a community centre in the heart of the Sydenham estate in Leamington Spa.

We are a registered charity which is needs led, provides a wide range of services and activities for the local community and beyond. We work collaboratively with a wide range of partner organisations, external organisations, and community volunteers to support people to gain confidence and improve their economic, social / cultural, health and wellbeing outcomes. We are looking for a small team of Youth Workers to engage and work with young people aged 11-18 on the Sydenham estate. The role will be based at The SYDNI Centre in Sydenham, Leamington Spa.

We have a vacancy for a **Youth Worker-In-Charge** which is for 8 hours a week. The post holder will be responsible for identifying the needs of young people within the community and developing a range of activities and opportunities to engage and support young people. You will also be responsible for the line management of the Youth Support Workers. You will need to be qualified to JNC Level 3 in Youth Work Practice.

Contract: The roles are for 12 months on a fixed term contract. All posts will require an Enhanced DBS Check.
