Welcome to the fourth edition of the attendance matters newsletter. We will be sharing the attendance update termly rather than monthly.

For the spring term we are acknowledging the announcement from Secretary of State Gillian Keegan to increase the fine to parents for taking leave during term time. It is important that all requests for leave during term time is made in advance via the Leave of Absence Request Form – a copy of which is available from the school office. The Warwickshire Attendance Service is the authority when considering to issue fixed penalty notices for non-attendance. At Lillington we strive every day to review and reflect upon how each child who is struggling to be in school can be best supported - there is no one size fits all. When children are in school, we are better placed to help and support the child and other family members as appropriate. Via our 5 S's and values framework we expect the very best from ourselves and our pupils and have high expectations for all. Attendance is key to ensuring the maximum benefit from school life.

Key facts:

- Arriving to school 15 minutes late each day over the course of a whole school career is the equivalent to missing one whole year of
 education.
- One full day a week of absence is the equivalent of 2.5 whole years of education missed.
- 10 days holiday leave a year is the equivalent of two whole terms of education missed.

WE ARE HERE TO HELP SUPPORT WITH PUNCTUALITY - PLEASE ASK.

Punctuality: It is important that your child attends school every day and on time. Arriving late to school is unsettling for children and disrupts the start to their day. Did you know? 10 minutes late every day adds up to 33 hours lost learning each year.

Routines: The easiest way to ensure your child attends school on time every day is to establish a good evening and morning routine. Mornings can be hectic in every household. Preparing as much as possible the night before will help a great deal. The Lillington school gates open at 8.35am and your child(ren)'s teacher will welcome them into their classroom. The school gates close at 8.45am please ensure your child is in class before the registers close.

Late: If your child arrives after 8.45am, please accompany them to the school office to sign in late. These late procedures are in place to help ensure that every child is entered onto the register correctly and can be accounted for in the event of an emergency. This is to ensure the Health and safety of your child(ren) and we thank you for your support with making sure that these procedures are always followed.

Tips to help with arriving at school on time each day.

Make sure your child knows why school is important and get everything ready together the night before school.

Show your child(ren) that you are interested in what they have achieved at school each day.

Set an alarm for your child and create a beat the clock game at home.

If you are unable to arrange appointments outside of school hours, please bring a copy of the appointment card to the school office. Pictures of the morning routine can help some children establish a morning pattern.

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What to do If your child is poorly and off school?


